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

We are now in the last two, rather shortened, weeks of term. Please see what's still coming up and make sure you prepare for school camp which starts on the last Sunday of the coming holidays. This is always a fantastic event.

We want to welcome in another new student into the school as we close out the term. Daniel Jobe, the younger brother of Ethan, has joined us at Year 2 and we very much welcome him into the school. For those keeping track we are now at 107 students.

Respect

This term as our eight core value development we have been working on respect. We have come at this from six angles that we think are important in developing this Godly characteristic—respect for God, respect for self, respect for others, respect for elders, respect for property, and respect for the environment.

We cover each of our core values once every two years. Our children develop a lot in that time and are in a different place when they revisit it again in two years time.

It is worth you continuing to build upon this at home too as they grow and move forward. Respect is one of the most clearly evident traits you can see. You can see it in the way they talk about God, themselves, their attitude toward others, toward you and their grandparents, how they look after their things and things owned by the family, and how they interact with the environment and treat animals. People who show respect will generally have respect shown back to them too. Conversely, those who don't show respect tend to be mistreated and disrespected regardless of how loudly they demand respect from others. Thus, the benefits are huge.

Respect comes from the heart and can be developed. Starting with respect for God should always be the starting point. We want our children to marvel at their Creator and have a deep love for Him. This will only come as they learn to spend time with Him, reading their Bibles and enjoying the things of God. Talk with them about this. There's instruction about this in Deuteronomy 11. This was written to parents and in verses 18—21 it says;

"So commit yourselves wholeheartedly to these words of mine. Tie them to your hands and wear them on your forehead as reminders. Teach them to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up. Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, so that as long as the sky remains above the earth, you and your children may flourish in the land the LORD swore to give your ancestors.

When you build in your children a respect and love for God everything else will flow from this. We want God's Word and

principles to be imprinted on their hearts, for out of it will flow all else that matters. This includes respecting themselves, the people and things around them. From such things will build a Godly worldview that colours the way they look at and interpret things, and it gives them hope.

Respect is big and as families we must continually keep building into it. Respect starts with God's Word and brings life to everything.

Children are usually very proud of their grandparents. Thank you to everybody for all the effort you put into helping this happen for them.






SCOLA MUFTI DAY

LEARNING JOURNAL NIGHT

Next week, in the final week of term, family members are invited to your children's Learning Journal night. At the end of each of Terms 1 - 3 students bring parents and family in to share about their learning and work from the preceding term. This is a student led interview



where your child does most of the talking. Research shows that when students can understand and talk about their learning they will engage in and take more responsibility for their own development. Once this happens learning becomes deeper and more powerful. We really want to encourage you to take the time to be involved in this as your involvement is a key factor in your child's learning success helping demonstrate to them what importance you place on their learning.

This night will be held next week on **Wednesday the 10th of April**. Classrooms are open between 3:30PM and 7PM. You do not need to make an appointment, just come along anytime between these times. This is not a parent - teacher interview but teachers will be there to help with explanations as necessary.

As part of these sessions we will be giving you our parent-student goal setting sheet. We know that learning at school is only a part of the overall learning a child is involved in. At home it is likely you are helping them work on non-school related things too. These can be fun or important and personal. It might be about them learning to tie their laces, wanting to master doing a cart wheel, or a discipline such as learning an instrument, or something to do with benefitting their health. Whatever it is this is part of their holistic learning and we want to give you the opportunity to include it in their goal setting.

As always, if you would like to discuss any aspect of your child's learning further, please make a time with the teacher. This applies all year round as we want parents to feel able to come in any time of the year and as often as is necessary.

OUR OP SHOP FUNDRAISER

Each year in May we are involved in running our local op shop for a week. This is a tremendous fundraiser for the school which allows us to take all the profits raised once the weekly rental is taken out. The school has traditionally done very well out of this.



In order for this to be a success we really need your help with two things please:

- 1. If you are having a clean out at home and have items that you are not trying to sell yourself and are willing to donate, we would be very grateful to receive these please. These can be brought to school in the first three weeks of next term and while the op shop is running.
- 2. We need lots of help through the week of Monday the 20th to Friday the 24th of May to run the shop. We need to have at least three people running the shop at a time. If you can spare some time, even if only an hour or two, please let Sarah in the school office know.

NEW ENROLMENT PROCEDURES

With the roll numbers hitting over 95% capacity the Board has now implemented an enrolment plan as per their enrolment policy. This means we have activated our enrolment scheme for the last positions available. At this stage, because of other already accepted enrolments, we have



just two places that have opened up and become available for the rest of this year. Both of these are preference positions which means they can only go to Christian families. From this point in time we will select from applications received twice per term until these positions are filled.

The first round of applications are being considered now and will close this term on **Thursday the 11th of April at 5PM**. If you know anyone who may want to start their children in the school this year please let them know of this and point them to our school website to fill in the pre-enrolment form. The criteria for selection can be found under enrolments on the school website. Please note that those who are already pre-enrolled do not need to apply now as they are already booked in.

You can also pre-enrol for 2025 or even later years now too. We are expecting to have very limited numbers available again in 2025 so we recommend people consider getting in quickly. Next term we will make an official call for 2025 enrolments.

We have even had some families start pre-enrolling for 2026 and 2027 too. If you have any siblings due to start in either of these years we would appreciate you doing this now please. This helps us reserve places for them but also helps us predict likely numbers for the future. This information is used to help us apply for a roll extension from the Ministry of Education. Our proprietor board are starting to put an application together to the Ministry now in the hope that we may be able to extend and have more positions available from 2025. Having potential enrolments helps support this case. We would appreciate your prayers for this.

CHECKING IN IF ARRIVING LATE

We realise that sometimes children may arrive late for school. If this happens please can we ask you to get them to check in at the school office. Class rolls are taken at the very beginning of the day and students not there from the start are marked absent for follow up from the school office.



CELEBRATING MISSIONS





SCHOOL CAMP

We've talked about it lots this term and now it's time to pack. Our whole school



camp kicks off at the end of the coming school holidays,
Sunday the 28th of April to Wednesday the 1st of May at
Finlay Park Adventure Camp. Forms for camp came home last
week and we need every family to have these returned to us
please by this Friday the 5th of April. We need these to help us
with our camp planning.

Camp starts at 4PM on the Sunday when you can arrive and set your children up in their cabins. Families are encouraged to all come and bring your own family picnic to enjoy from 5:30PM.

After dinner we will have family church together. At the end of church camp officially begins and parents not staying can say goodbye and leave us to it. Juniors will prepare for bed and the older children will play games together.



Camp officially ends at 1:30PM on Wednesday the 1st and children must please be picked up by 3PM. You will need to please arrange for your children to be picked up and let us know who will be collecting them.

Full details of camp can be found in the camp booklet that came home last week. Please feel free to tear off and keep pages 1—4 for your reference and return to us pages 5—12 with all the forms you will have filled in.

We have run whole school camps every two years over the last 16 years now. This is a great way to bond our school, house teams and community together. Regardless of age we get to provide our students with fantastic outdoor experiences, great learning and provide them with fresh challenges.

Because the purpose of camp is about bonding our school together and building school culture, we intentionally have it fairly close to home. Finlay Park are friends of the school and do a brilliant job of hosting us. The camp is only 20—25 minutes from Matamata and is located on stunning grounds on the banks of Lake Karapiro. Parents are welcome and

encouraged to come and be part of camp for the whole three nights, or join us for a day, or drop out for a visit after work and be part of the fun. If you want to attend camp we also need to have a Police Vet check done for all volunteers. Please come to the office as soon as possible to help us get this done (checks are valid for three



years and let you be involved in other events with us too).

Camp is a very important part of our programme and has a very big impact on every child, regardless of age. If you have any concerns please come and talk these through with your classroom teacher or with Mr Paterson.

The cost of camps have gone up significantly but we have worked hard to keep these down for everyone. We are pleased to be able to keep the costs down to **just \$210** for students and adults this year. To achieve this we will need to ask families to also send along some baking or biscuits for camp please. If you have children with dietary needs please make your baking or biscuits to suit them and label it for us.

Some families may struggle with costs but note you can start paying these off now and you have until the end of the school year to finish paying it off if you need this. If you are in



a position to be able to contribute any extra amount to help those in need please let us know too. We want to make sure everyone gets to go as camp provides valuable experiences to our children.



HOW DO I FIND FINLAY PARK?

Finlay Park Adventure Camp is based on Lake Karapiro and is about 25 minutes drive from Matamata. To get there exit Matamata taking the main highway to Hamilton.

- After turning right at Piarere onto State Highway 1 (still heading toward Hamilton and Cambridge) travel approximately 1km and take the first left onto Maungatautari Road.
- Go to the end of this road and turn left onto Oreipunga Road.
- Travel 300m and turn left into Finlay Road. At the end of this are two camps. Finlay Park is on the left.
- This year we are at the main camp. Upon entering Finlay Park follow the driveway on the left through to the carpark.

GEAR LIST

Here's what to bring, and what to leave at home...

WINTER UNIFORM

As the mornings get colder we are readying to change into winter uniform from the beginning of next term. This simply means changing footwear from sandals to black shoes.

Shoes should be black leather or leather look lace up shoes. We will also accept black leather slip on shoes and velcro shoes instead of lace ups for younger students. Shoes must not be sports or fashion shoes please.
