IT'S TIME FOR THE CHRISTMAS WALKTHROUGH

We've hit December and it's now time for our bi-annual Christmas Walkthrough. This Tuesday evening we are very excited to bring you The Story Begins, a five scene retelling of key elements of the Christmas story. The show runs for one night only, tomorrow night, and is open to the whole Matamata community.

Tomorrow night we please need all our students dropped off to get into their costumes from 5:30PM. Once dropped off, unless a helper, we will then ask you to line up at the school's front gate for the show to start at 6PM. Groups will go through about 15 at a time.

Each scene runs for a pre set period of time. You will stay with your group and walk through each of the five scenes through to the end which finishes near the playground at the manger where Jesus has been born and a choir will be singing. Your children will be in one of the five scenes.



Each of the scenes is repeated until everyone has been through. In past years this has taken approximately an hour.

At the end you are very welcome to join our community to relax and enjoy the singing, each others company and unwind as we prepare for Christmas. There will be sausages, burgers, cakes, cold drinks, tea and coffee for sale for you to enjoy. You are very welcome to bring your own food and have a picnic dinner if you would like to. This is a chance for you to enjoy the community.

During the performance can we please ask you not to have any other children on the playground as the noise from this may drown out the choir in the manger scene. Children are very welcome on the playground after the performance is finished.

Please remember entry is completely free and anyone is welcome to come. Invite friends and family and your church. We usually get good numbers.

Parking will be available on the school field and we ask you please to drive very slowly and be aware of people walking through.

PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS

We're nearly at Christmas, and this is the last school newsletter of the year. We want to thank you for all the support you have given us throughout it. This has been a year where the school has grown considerably and there have been many changes. It has been a good year and we hope it has been for you too.

In this edition you will note there are still a lot of things on in the last two weeks of term. We hope you can be a part of them, and especially the Christmas Walkthrough tomorrow night.

This event helps turn our eyes toward Christmas and the important message we have to share. But we also want to help with that by adding a set of Advent devotions that you can share together over 25 days. Give them a try as a family. Families are important to God and yours matters to Him very much. He wants your family to be a safe, loving haven where you can raise your children to love and obey Him and believe in His Son, Jesus.

Remember, as parents, God gives you the awesome job of teaching your children about Him and His Word. At school we help you with that but you are the one who has the mandate from God. The Bible says in Deuteronomy 6:4—9: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

I shared the first nine days of these devotions in the last edition of the newsletter, so here we carry on with them picking up from day 10. If you can't find your last newsletter this is available on the school website under 'News and Events'.

Advent Devotions Part II (Advent means coming)

Day 10— A Parent to Love Me: An Angel tells Joseph Mary's Baby is God's own Son. Read *Matthew 1:18—24*. If your child is old enough for the discussion discuss what the circumstances and repercussions were in these times for Mary being pregnant.

Day 11— No Complaining: Joseph and Mary leave for Bethlehem. Read *Luke 2:1—5*. Reflect on what this journey must have been like for Mary—a considerable distance on a donkey. Understand that travelling to Bethlehem would fulfil a prophecy written 700 years before in *Micah 5:2*.

Day 12— Happy Birthday, Jesus!: Jesus is born. Read *Luke 2:6—7*. Reflect on where Jesus was born, not where someone so deserving should be born. The stable reminds us that **Jesus came into the world with nothing**. The shepherds represent us – the people that Jesus came to serve. Sheep play an important role in the stories in the Bible. Jesus is referred to as the Lamb of God.

Day 13— A Whole Lot of Angels: A group of angels praise God. Read *Luke 2:13—14*. Why did the angels make such a public announcement?

Day 14— Scared Shepherds: Angels appear to the shepherds. Read *Luke 2:8—14.* How do you think you would have responded if you had been one of these shepherds?

Day 15— Good News: The shepherds spread the Good News of Jesus' birth. Read *Luke 2:15—18*. The shepherds actually spread the Good News everywhere they went. That's your job too!

Day 16— What's in a Name?: Simeon and Anna meet Jesus in the Temple. Read *Luke 2:22—38*. Jesus was six weeks old when He was taken to the Temple as per the requirements. Why do you think this was so special to Simeon and Anna? Simeon means 'hearing', Anna means 'grace' or 'favour'. What do your names mean?

Day 17— Follow the Star: The Magi follow the star. Read *Matthew* 2:1—2. There is a long history to the Magi. Back in Daniel's day he

had trained them in Scripture and what signs to look out for. While legend has us believe there were three Magi it is likely there were a lot more, and they would have travelled with their own special army! Herod claimed to be king and had bought this position from Rome. The Magi were quick to point out they were searching for one born to be King.

Day 18— Just One King: King Herod is jealous of Jesus. Read *Matthew 2:3—8.* Jerusalem was in tumultuous times. It was close to the border and wars were frequent. Herod had not long been in Jerusalem because it had been too dangerous for him to be there prior. The city was on edge with the arrival of the Magi and Herod could only see Jesus as a threat to his authority.

Day 19— Gifts for a King: The Magi give gifts to Jesus. Read *Matthew 2:9—11*. It is unlikely the Magi arrived the night of Jesus birth. It could have been some time after. The Magi's gifts were picked prophetically. Why give a baby gifts such as gold, frankincense and myrrh? They represented Christ's role of King, Priest, and Saviour. Gold represented His Kingship, frankincense was a spice used in priestly duties, but myrrh was an embalming ointment signifying His death to come!

Day 20— Escape: Joseph, Mary, and Jesus escape to Egypt. Read *Matthew 2:12—15*. Why do you think they were on the run to Egypt?

Day 21— Safe: Herod sends soldiers to Bethlehem. Read *Matthew 2:16—18*. It was nearly two years before Herod actioned his troops. But what awful orders they had. How do you think the people would have responded to Herod after this? There was another time in history when such an order had been given, do you remember what that was for?

Day 22— Home Again: Jesus and His family go home to Nazareth. Read *Matthew 2:19—23*. Note here that more prophecy is being fulfilled. Also note there were two Herod's around at these times. The first that had ordered the deaths of children under two was now dead. A short time later came one who was a bit of a party-king and somewhat of a loose canon.

Day 23— The Waiting Reward: Jesus grows up in Nazareth. Read *Luke 2:39—52*. These were years Jesus spent preparing for His mission which started when He was about 30 years old. It is interesting to note that many people hit there stride in ministry when they are in their 30's.

Day 24— The Rising Sun: Jesus brings Light into the world. Read *Isaiah 9:2* and *Luke 1:78—79*. How is God's Word the Light? By contrast what is darkness?

Day 25— Coming Again: Jesus is coming back to Earth. Read *Acts 1:9—11*. Ponder what this might mean.

Did you know there were some 200 prophecies to help us recognise Jesus in His first-coming and when that first-coming would be? Jesus will return again and there are nearly eight times more prophecies about His second-coming than the first time that you can explore!

May you and your family be really blessed this Christmas. Merry Christmas!

This will take place in the last week on Wednesday the 13th of December. More details will be sent home for this.


SCHOOL REPORTS

Pubertal Changes will be taught this week on **Thursday the 7th of December**.


UNIFORM SHOP

FINAL ACCOUNTS

A reminder that all school accounts need to please be paid for the end of the school year (Friday the 15th of December). This includes all camp payments from Terms 1 and 3 which families have been allowed to pay off over the course of the school year.



Those parents who are paying their school attendance dues by automatic payment may of course carry on doing so but please make sure that payments being made do cover your children's dues by the end of the year (31 December).

The school relies on accounts being paid on time as this enables the school to spend annual budgets on student resources and upkeep, something we are doing a lot of at the moment. When accounts aren't paid on time the school has to cover these debts from budgeted money that was intended for student resources.

We try hard to keep costs as low as possible and outside of attendance dues we are **only** charging for major events such as camps and sport outside of school. Thus we really appreciate these accounts being paid as soon as possible.

If you are having problems with payments please do come and discuss this so we can make a plan to help. We never want to see our families struggle because of their school accounts.








Church Community Notices
